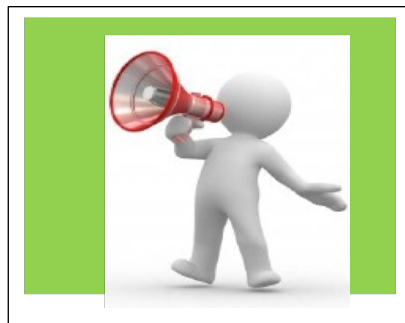

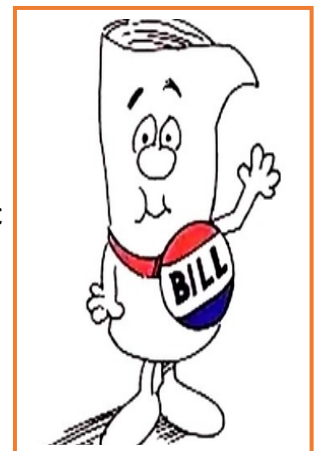

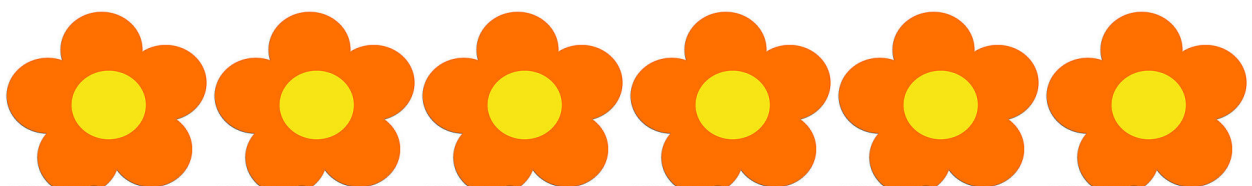
Join the SCC CAAIEYC Public Policy Committee!

What is public policy?

Public policy is like playdough in the field of early childhood education. It can be molded and shaped by the decisions that legislators make. Your voice is important and needs to be heard by your legislator because you have valuable information about your work in early childhood that can help your legislator decide how to vote on a **public policy** issue.



Public policy is just like playdough in that it has benefits in development and early learning. Good **public policy** supports funding for childcare, early learning, and the ECE workforce. Remember your legislator only has one vote and you want to ask for their support.



Public policy just like playdough can be messy. You must be able to communicate clearly to your legislator about the **public policy** you propose, know what the problem is, and recommend solutions.

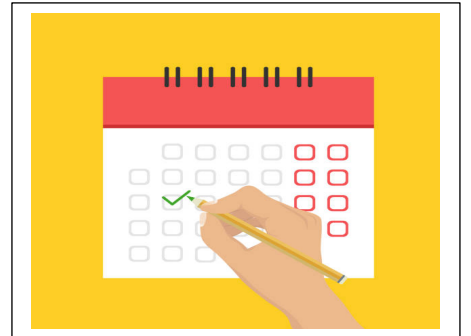
